Sankranti Celebrations

Sankranthi is a harvest festival, when farmers celebrate the harvest season. Houses are cleaned, thorana of mango leaves are tied and people wear new clothes. In rural areas, there is a custom of offering prayers to the crops or the harvest. Sun god is also worshipped. People exchange 'ellu-bella' with a small piece of sugarcane and with a sugar candy (sakkare acchu – prepared using small wooden moulds) with their friends and neighbours. This tradition is known as 'ellubirodhu' in Karnataka. Rangoli competition, kite flying competition and other traditional sports like kusti are organized in some rural areas.



Republic Day Celebration



On 26th January, Republic Day was celebrated to mark the transition of India from a British empire to an independent Republic. The students enacted a role play related to Dr B. R. Ambedkar and the committee submitting a draft of the Indian Constitution. They Sang patriotic songs and danced to signify the culture of each state. Miming was performed to create an awareness regarding the progress of incredible India.


National Youth Day
